Responding to an article that appeared in a Parisian newspaper *Revue des Deux Mondes*, Dumas angrily and passionately responds to the author of the article. *“It’s time that will place things, especially literary matters where they belong. The author is always in the worst position to discuss his own body of work, while the public is judging it... . I don’t belong to a caste, or school or church and nobody or anything on earth could make me do anything that I don’t want to do or prevent me from saying what I have to say. ... We live in a time where very few people have the right or the means to say what they think and where those who really think about something are really rarer.”* **\$2,500.00**

Heinecken was one of the most influential artists of the 60’s and 70’s, influenced himself by the Surrealist and Dada Movements. Original leather boards with several cracks and chips which have been professionally repaired and spine re-backed in 1917 with the hand written addition of her 1783 *An Elegy, Sacred To The Memory of that Great Divine, The Reverend And Learned Dr. Samuel Cooper* in an unknown hand. Title page has been restored after considerable damage. The front endpaper bears the ownership signature of Abigail S. Safford of Salem, one of the earliest families to come to Massachusetts from England in the 17<sup>th</sup> century and a family name tied to the American Revolutionary War as well as the Salem witch trials. A very collectible copy of a landmark book. **\$27,500.00**
